Electric Choice

NOTE: Choice rates are closed (i.e., the choice cap is 0%) as of Michigan Public Service Commission order U-18377, dated July 12, 2017. As of February 1, 2019, the choice cap will return to 10%.

Under Michigan Public Act 141, signed into law in June 2000, the state's electric industry was restructured. Customers of the state's two largest utilities are able to select their energy supplier, with certain limitations. This means they may select the company that generates their electric power, although the actual transmission of the power and delivery to their home or business will still be provided and billed by the original utility.

Cooperative customers with loads of 1 MW or more have supplier choice as of October 10, 2010.
